



University of South Australia Rural Reconnect Relocation Scholarships

INFORMATION SHEET

The University of South Australia maintains a strong commitment to providing opportunities to those experiencing educational disadvantage. The Rural Reconnect Project is designed to encourage greater participation, retention and achievement of rural and remote students in higher education, the University of South Australia Rural Reconnect Relocation Scholarships were established to assist with the costs of moving to the city to pursue higher education. Four scholarships valued at \$6,000 each are available to assist students from rural and isolated areas to fund their relocation costs.

Eligibility Criteria

The recipients must be Australian citizens or permanent residents, and be commencing full-time study in an undergraduate degree program at the University of South Australia. The recipients will be selected on the basis of:

- Demonstrated financial disadvantage.
- Academic merit based on Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR).
- A character reference. The character reference must also verify that the applicant has lived in a rural or isolated area for at least four years prior to the scholarship application.
- Having completed Year 12 within the last 2.5 years
- A personal written statement (250 words) detailing career and personal goals, and how the recipient intends to give back to the community by either:
 - Returning to their high school and addressing Year 11 and 12 students regarding their university experience
 - Assisting with the University of South Australia Orientation Program for Year 10 rural and isolated students
 - Assisting with gap year engagement activities.

Recipients must be willing to participate in scholarship research and provide a written reflection at the conclusion of their scholarship.

Payment

The scholarship is valued at \$6,000 and payments are split into three instalments: \$2,000 in January, \$3,000 after Study Period 2 Census Date and \$1,000 at the conclusion of Study Period 5, subject to demonstrated community involvement.

Conditions for ongoing eligibility of the scholarship

- Continuance of the scholarship is subject to the recipient's adherence to the scholarship criteria, and decisions to withdraw a scholarship will be at the discretion of the Selection Committee.
- Recipients must maintain satisfactory academic performance during the scholarship term.
- Recipients must be enrolled full-time and some study must be internal.
- Recipients must contribute to their local community.
- Recipients must participate in scholarship research.
- Recipients must submit a written reflection at the conclusion of their scholarship.

Notes

- Preference may be given to gap year students who have deferred their studies in 2012 and are commencing study at the University of South Australia in 2013.
- The scholarship may, in some instances, be counted as income against Youth Allowance or other forms of Government assistance payments. Applicants should seek independent financial advice.

Lodgement Details and Closing Dates

It is important to submit **all** relevant documentary evidence to support your application. Failure to do so will mean that the application will not be considered.
