

City East Campus Map


The Sansom Institute for Health Research Clinical Trial Facility (depicted as **SIHR** on the map below) is located at the City East Campus in the Bonython Jubilee (BJ) Building, Level 1 (ground level.)

Enter the campus from Frome Road gate 4 via the ramp or down the stairs that are next to the pedestrian lights on Frome Road. The building is accessible through the double glass doors. Come down the stairs and enter the door on the right. This will lead you directly into the reception/waiting area. (See Photos 1,2,&3)

If you arrive before 7.30am or need disabled ramp acess please continue down the walkway between Playford Building (P) and Bonython Jubilee Building (BJ) and enter through the automatic doors into Bonython Jubilee and follow the signs.

Car parking can be scarce in the city centre so public transport is recommended. Car parking facilities are available on **Victoria Drive**, and there are also car parks within walking distance to the Facility: Wilson Parking – 15 Frome Rd, Ezi Park – Pulteney St, Bent St Car Park.

City East campus is serviced by many main bus routes, with other main stops no more than two blocks away. The railway station and tram is also within walking distance.

From the North

Take the O-Bahn from Tea Tree Plaza, Paradise or Klemzig interchanges

Take the train

Take the bus along these Go Zones to Adelaide -North East, Main North, Prospect and Churchill Roads

From the East

Take the Bus along these Go Zones to Adelaide - Duthy Street, Goodwood, Unley and King William Roads, Winston Avenue, Glen Osmond, Payneham and Magill Roads, Coorara Avenue, The Parade and Kensington Road. Buses

From the West

Take the train from any train station on the Outer harbor or Grange line.

Take the bus along these GoZones to Adelaide - Torrens, Port, Grange, Tapleys Hill and Henley Beach Roads, Sir Donald Bradman Drive and Richmond and Crittendon Roads Buses 155, 156 and 157 run to/from West Lakes Shopping Centre along Port Road to the City.

From the South

Take the train from any station along the Seaford line

Take the bus. Bus T721 runs from Noarlunga Centre Interchange to Adelaide every 30 minutes along Main South and Anzac Highway. Catch a bus along these Go Zones to Adelaide

- Main South Road, South Roads, Anzac Highway and Marion Road.

Take the Tram. The tram to King William Street from Glenelg runs every 7½ minutes at peak times and every 10-20 minutes at other times. Free travel is available between South Terrace and North Terrace.

Adelaide Free

The Adelaide Free City Loop (99c) bus provides free transport approximately every 15 minutes from Monday to Friday between City East Campus (Stop 10 or28), Railway Station (Stop 8 or 25), City West Campus (Stop 6,7,22 or 23) and Victoria Square.
