# Simon Terrill: Crowd Theory Adelaide, Victoria Square/ Tarntanyangga unveiled!

The Samstag Museum of Art, University of South Australia, unveils a photographic portrait of Victoria Square, Tarntanyangga by artist Simon Terrill on Thursday 2 May 2013, 6 – 8 pm. These spectacularly immersive images, the latest in Terrill's *Crowd Theory* series, are a result of his *Crowd Theory Adelaide* photographic event which took place earlier this year at Victoria Square/Tarntanyangga.

On 27 February at dusk, 350 people converged upon the specially opened work-site at Victoria Square/Tarntanyangga in response to Simon Terrill's invitation to interact with each other and their environment to capture a moment in time.

The artist's selection of Victoria Square/Tarntanyangga as the *Crowd Theory Adelaide* site was in response to its significance as a gathering place for local Indigenous people long before William Light conceived a plan for Adelaide in 1837, as well as Adelaide City Council's plans for its redevelopment.

Crowd Theory Adelaide was timed to coincide with this crucial point of change, to capture the last moments of the Square in its familiar shape before its transformation. Terrill's ongoing series of photographic events explores ideas of community and the nature of crowds.

*Crowd Theory Adelaide: Victoria Square/Tarntanyangga 2013* was commissioned by the Samstag Museum of Art, University of South Australia.
