

Commonwealth scholarships

There are a range of Commonwealth scholarships available to assist Indigenous students, particularly from remote and regional areas. Examples include:

- > Indigenous Commonwealth Accommodation Scholarships Value: \$5199 per annum
- > Indigenous Commonwealth Education Costs Scholarships Value: \$2599 per annum

International scholarships

We offer a number of scholarships to international students to support their study and achievements. These include:

- > International Merit Scholarships: Recipients receive a 25% reduction in their student contributions for their first year.
- > Vice Chancellor's International Excellence Scholarship: Recipients receive a 50% reduction in their student contributions per annum, for up to four years of full-time study. Up to 20 scholarships are available in 2017.

The University also funds a number of other grants to help lessen the cost of study:

- > UniSA Placement Grants Value: \$2500 one-off payment
- > UniSA Study Grants Value: \$2000 per annum

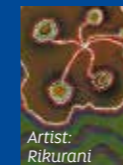

Students in financial need

There are a number of scholarships aimed at assisting students in situations of financial disadvantage with the costs of university study. These can include assistance with tuition fees, cash grants for textbooks and materials, and more.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students

Some scholarships offer assistance specifically for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students. Many are named in honour of prominent Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, and are offered by both the University as well as related agencies and organisations.

Examples:

Gavin Wanganeen Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Scholarship	\$5000 p.a. – up to \$20,000 FN UG PG NS HA C
University of South Australia Scholarship for Power Cup participants	\$2000 p.a. – up to \$8000 FN UG NS
Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander MBA Scholarship	Full program fee is provided in partnership with industry PG NS

Rural students

Students from rural and isolated areas may be eligible for scholarships to help with the relocation costs of moving to the city to pursue full-time study. A number of grants also exist to support students studying or undertaking placements in rural and remote areas.

Rural Reconnect Relocation Scholarship	\$6000 UG R FN HA

Placement grants

The costs associated with undertaking a professional placement can be high, so the University of South Australia offers a number of placement grants to help meet these costs.
