**Professor Lee Parker** is Professor of Accounting in the School of Commerce at the University of South Australia, Honorary Professor of Management & Accounting Control the University of St Andrews, Scotland, and Adjunct Professor of Accounting in the Auckland University of Technology School of Business. With over 150 published articles and books on management and accounting, he is joint founding editor of *Accounting, Auditing and Accountability Journal* and serves on over 25 other journal editorial boards. Lee has been President of the Academy of Accounting Historians, the American Accounting Association Public Interest section and Vice-President International of the American Accounting Association. His expertise spans strategic management, corporate governance, corporate social and environmental responsibility, management accounting, public/nonprofit sector management, accounting and management history and qualitative research methodology.

**Professor Kerry Jacobs** is the Head of the School of Accounting and Business Information Systems at the Australian National University in Canberra. He has held posts at La Trobe University in Melbourne, the University of Edinburgh in Scotland and the University of Canterbury in New Zealand. Professor Jacobs' research and publications are focused on issues of public sector accountability, governance, audit, financial management and reform, particularly the relationship between accounting and politics. He is currently on the editorial board of *Accounting, Auditing and Accountability Journal*, *Financial Accountability & Management* and *Journal of Accounting and Organizational Change*. Professor Jacobs also has research interests in accounting in religious organisations and the links between culture and accounting.
