INTRODUCTION TO LAW LAWS 1002

**(also known from 2010 as Foundations of Business Law COML 1001)
SP 1 2010, CITY WEST CAMPUS**

Introduction to Law will be taught by Nick Drake and Nadia Hess. The course runs for 8 days (on MWF of each week) over a three week period. Class times are from 10 am – 4pm on each of those days. Students are expected to attend the City West campus and participate in all of the classes as well as doing independent study during that period.

Introduction to Law gives an introduction to the common law legal system and to two basic concepts of business law; contract and agency. These basic concepts are very important not only in South Australia but also in the other States and around the common law world in countries such as the United Kingdom, India, Canada, Hong Kong and New Zealand.

The material covered will be the same as the material delivered each year in SP2 and SP5. It will just be delivered in a more concentrated form.

There are three assessment tasks made up of two assignments and one exam.

Students must have studied previously at UniSA to be eligible to enrol for this course.

The textbooks are Graw and Pembroke et al. Students who are repeating and have purchased the OUP (green) text will not be disadvantaged.
