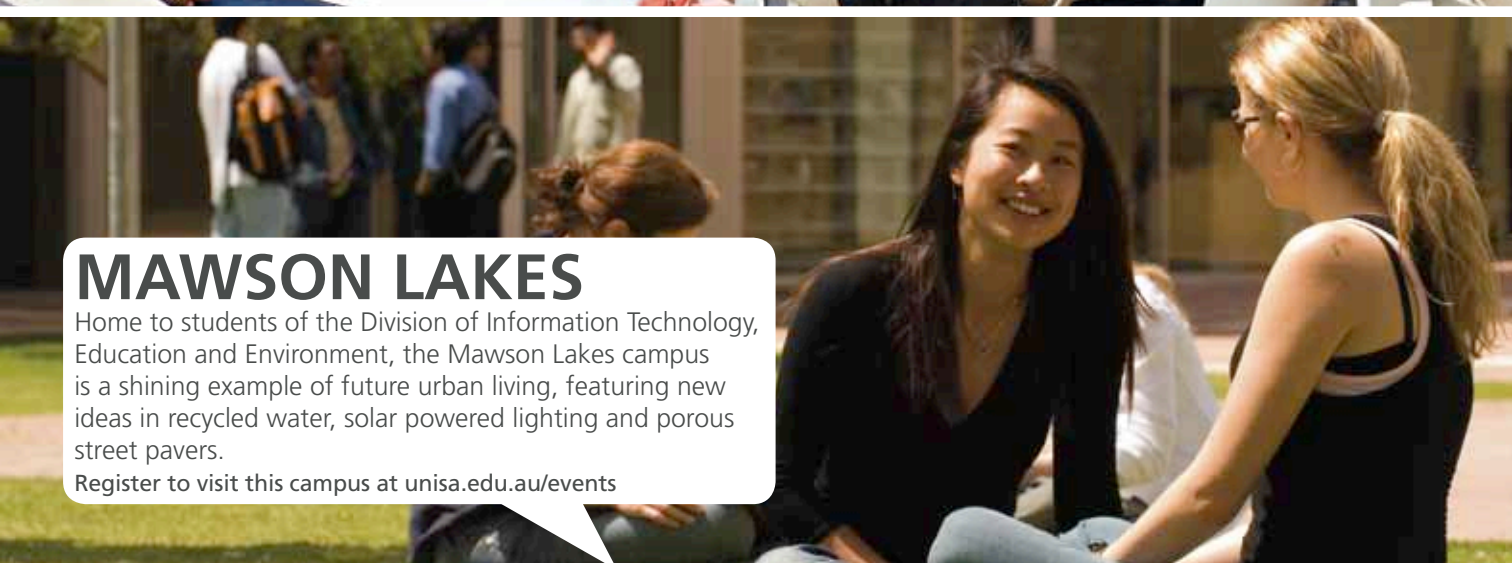
## CITY WEST

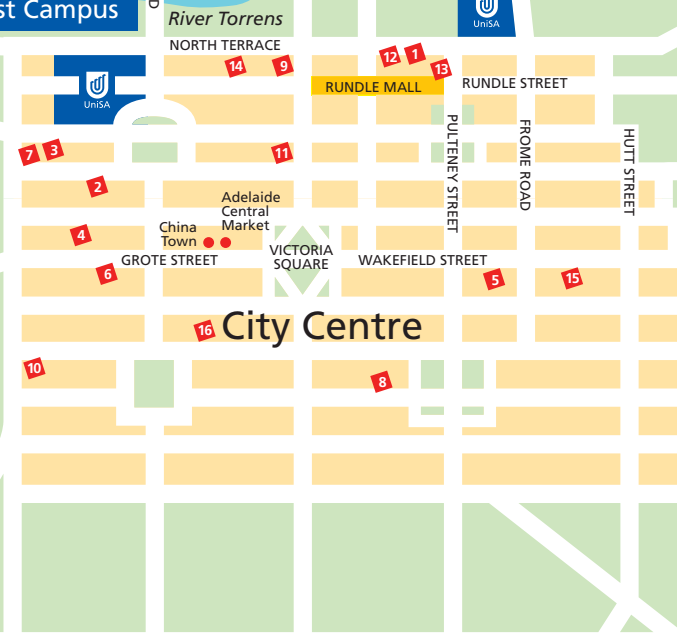
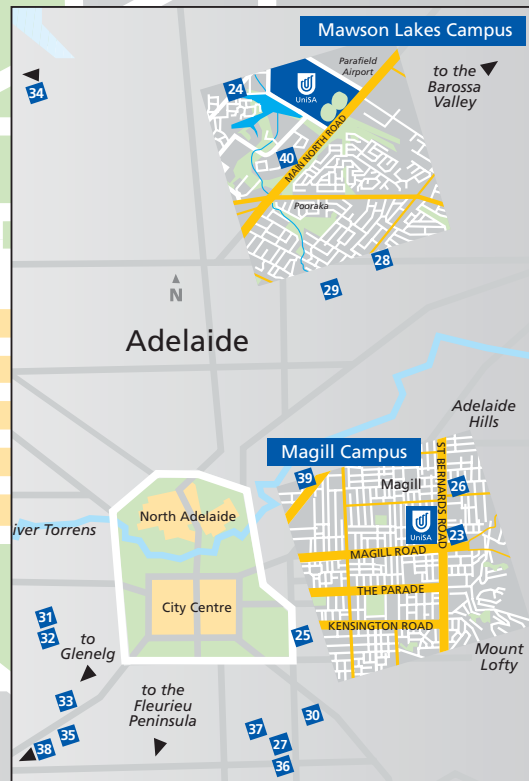
