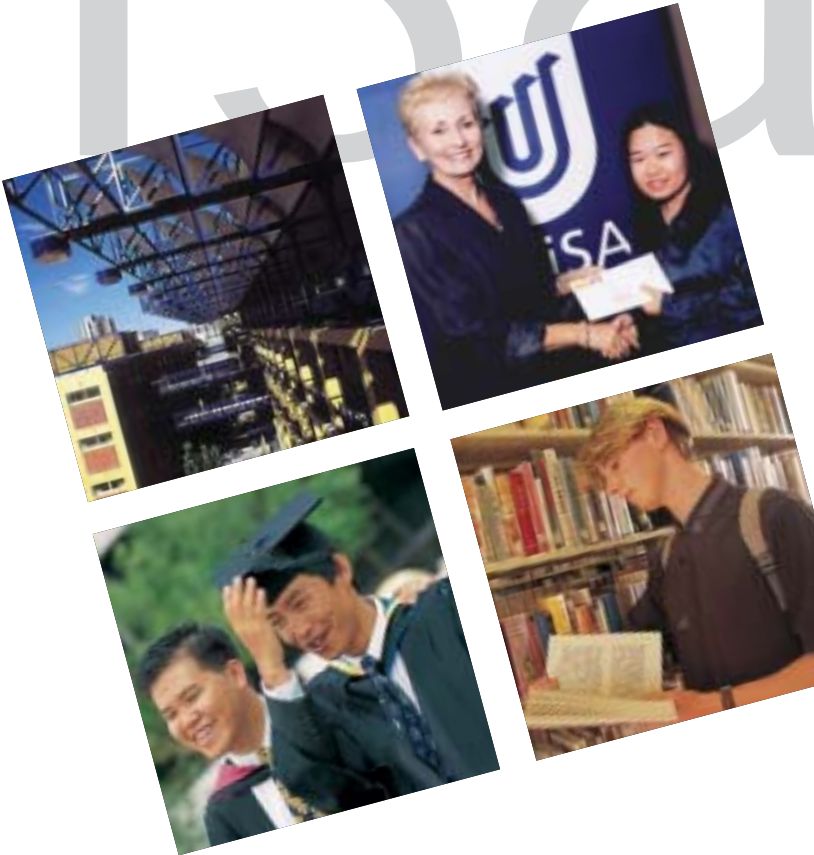

Section 1: Review of Activities

1.1 The Foundation Inc

The University of South Australia Foundation Inc is the preferred giving channel for the University.

First established in 1992 after the formation of the University of South Australia in 1991, the Foundation seeks to attract and retain the continuing interest and financial support of the community, staff, alumni and friends of the University for the benefit of its education mission.

The Foundation Inc is administered and supported by the University of South Australia through the Foundation Committee of Management. The University Development Board, chaired by the Chancellor of the University, Mr David Klingberg AM, assists in its fundraising activities.

The Foundation Inc was again appreciative of the many members of the community who provided their own time to assist with fundraising and other corporate related activities. The Foundation Inc is grateful to the members of the Bequest Committee and in particular the Chairperson, Mr Norton Jackson AM, who again gave a great deal of his time to assist with bequest activities and act as master of ceremonies at the Successful Ageing seminars.

1.2 2002 Activities and Achievements

Scholarships campaign

Commenced in 2000, the scholarships campaign continued with a particular focus on corporate named scholarships.

There are now a total of nine named undergraduate scholarships at UniSA as a result of the scholarships campaign. At the end of 2002 the scholarships appeal had resulted in additional gifts and pledges of approximately \$64,000.

Transition Grants

For the second year, the University presented a set of transition grants. The grants were awarded to 25 students. Thanks to the support of Mutual Community, four grants worth \$2,500 each were awarded in the Health Science area. Five rural UniSA transition grants of \$1,500 each and ten metropolitan grants of \$1,000 each were also awarded.

2002 Annual Appeal – Research for Life Appeal

For the year under review, the focus of the annual appeal fundraising was the University's research activities.

Approximately \$43,000 was raised and five bequest enquiries were received as a result of this campaign.



The Smith Family Learning for Life campaign collaboration

This year the University developed a close alliance with The Smith Family. The two institutions signed a memorandum of understanding in 2001 that outlined collaborative fundraising, research and other community outreach collaborations. This was the first such agreement between a university and The Smith Family. The agreement flows from the commitment by both organisations to extend educational opportunity - the University, through its ongoing access and equity initiatives, and The Smith Family, through its successful *Learning for Life* program.

Collaborative activity in 2002 saw approximately \$83,000 raised for the Smith Family Learning for Life program. This will result in the awarding of nine transition scholarships by the Foundation to Learning for Life students entering UniSA in 2003 from donations made by individuals and the following corporations:

Sansom Pharmacy Trust

Bequests

The Peter Stephens bequest was realised in 2002. The bequest will be used to set up **The P W Stephens Engineering Prize** for the best student in the first year of the Bachelor of Engineering (Mechanical and Manufacturing Engineering) or the Bachelor of Engineering (Robotics and Intelligent Manufacturing) degree program.

The Southcott bequest is still in the process of being finalised. The bequest was made for the purpose of setting up the William T Southcott Scholarship to assist outstanding postgraduate students in the field of practical engineering.

Special event activity

As part of its ongoing engagement with the community, the Development Office undertook a range of special events:

- *Chancellor's Challenge Golf Classic*
The third annual charity golf day was held at the Grange Golf Course. It was again an outstanding event and money raised was used to support the Research for Life appeal. For the second year running, Dr Kia Ngee Chew, Deputy Chairman, PriceWaterhouseCooper, presented a generous personal gift to the University.
- *UniSA 'Brain Drain' Quiz Night*
The third Quiz Spectacular was held at the Magill Campus. More than 400 staff took up the challenge and proceeds were used to support the Transition Grant campaign.

- *Successful Ageing Seminars*

As part of the University's Bequest Program, health and lifestyle seminars are held for the benefit of older people in the community. Aimed at the 55-year plus age group, these seminars give information about health and lifestyle issues. The speakers, who are able to give the latest information about research, are mainly sourced from within the University. Reflecting the community service ethos of the University, the seminars act as an instrument to engage the community and showcase the expertise and the relevance of the University. Four seminars were held in 2002 including one country and three metropolitan seminars.

Topics included:

- > Nuclear Medicine, Bone Densitometry and You
- > Quality Use of Medicines (Whyalla)
- > The Future is Here
- > Health and Active Ageing

- *Blueprints and Cocktails*

The first of an ongoing series of cocktail functions was held late in 2002 to promote the University's Blueprint 2005 program, which will see major capital development on its City West, City East, Magill and Mawson Lakes campuses. The \$100m investment by the University in South Australia will provide new amenities for students as well as consolidating the campus structure of the University.



1.3 Trust Highlights

- *Aboriginal Advancement League*
The Aboriginal Advancement League annually awards study grants to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders. The study grants are awarded based on grade point average, to postgraduate students and medical students studying at either the Flinders University or the University of South Australia. This year four grants of \$1,000 were awarded to full-time students:
 - > Ms Colleen Clarke - Flinders University – Master of Arts
 - > Mr Kim Berry – Master of Primary Health Care
 - > Ms Moyna Carter – Master of Aboriginal Studies
 - > Ms Kiara Passmore – Master of Artsand one grant of \$500 to part-time student:
 - > Ms Sara Naqase - Master of Arts.
- *Irene and David Davy Scholarship*
This scholarship is awarded annually and is open to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students at the University of South Australia who are enrolled in the final year of an undergraduate course or who are honors students. The 2002 scholarship, valued at \$3,000 was awarded to Ms Sheena D'Angelo.
- *The Bob Hawke Prime Ministerial Centre 2002 Foundation*
In 2002, considerable effort was devoted to strategic planning for fundraising in 2003 within Australia, marking the 20th Anniversary of Bob Hawke as Prime Minister and the much-anticipated release of designs for the planned new building. With the assistance of Mr Hawke, meetings were arranged with several key potential donors, and plans established for anniversary fundraising opportunities in Asia arising from Mr Hawke's strong business relationships in the region.

The Bob Hawke Prime Ministerial Centre's donation receipts for 2002 amounted to \$34,112.77.

Exposure for the Centre was again ensured through an active public program, including these highlights:

- > Two Salon des Intellectuels forums in the famous Spiegeltent at the Adelaide Fringe
- > The Encounter Lecture Series - February to April 2002 - as part of Encounter 2002, the Flinders - Baudin Commemoration
- > Annual Hawke Lecture delivered by Noel Pearson attended by 1,000 people at the Adelaide Town Hall
- > Continued involvement in the OECD International Futures Programme and especially the International Systemic Risk project.

The Hawke Centre wishes to record its particular appreciation of the generosity and genuine interest of the late Jean Blackburn, whose life contribution to equity in Australian education as a former member of the Australian Schools Commission and in many other capacities, was outstanding.

The Foundation has adopted an appropriately conservative investment position and actively monitors fund performance on a regular basis.

- *University support*

The University of South Australia, through the Development Office within the Marketing and Development Unit (MDU), provided management and administrative support to the Foundation during 2002 at no cost. Funds raised by the Foundation are applied in full to the benefit of individual projects or activity.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2002

1. Purpose

The University of South Australia Foundation Incorporated (the Foundation) was established in April 1992 to assist the cause of education by providing support, both material and otherwise, to the University of South Australia (the University).

2. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Preparation of the Financial Statements

The accounts of the Foundation have been drawn up in accordance with the disclosure requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act, 1985. They have been prepared on an accrual basis and in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards as appropriate.

(b) Economic Dependency

The economic viability of the Foundation is dependent upon the continuing financial support of the University and on the Foundation's ability to attract and retain the continuing interest, financial support and assistance of the community in general, and of the staff, Alumni and other friends of the University. During the year the Foundation's operations utilised the services, facilities and staff of the University for nil consideration.

(c) Income Tax

The Foundation is a tax-exempt body under the Income Tax Assessment Act, 1936.

(d) Subsidiaries

The Foundation does not have any subsidiary entities.

(e) Trust Funds

The Foundation administers a range of donations and bequests from external parties. Administration of these funds is in accordance with the terms and conditions of receipt. Both the funds received and any earnings on investment are applied for the intended purpose.

Any funds for which the Foundation acts as trustee or custodian are reflected within the financial statements.

The names of the Trusts for which the Foundation acts as Trustee or custodian are:

- Aborigines Advancement League;
- Davy Scholarship;
- Donald Dyer Scholarship;
- Lydia Longmore Memorial Fund;
- The PW Stephens Engineering Prize; and
- William T Southcott Scholarship.

(f) Hawke Centre

The Foundation has received monies in relation to the Hawke Centre for the purpose of contributing to a University building to house the Centre. As at 31 December 2002, the Foundation held an amount of \$722,386 for the building. These monies will be transferred to the University in future periods.

INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT
