

AIESEC is the international platform for young people to discover and develop their potential. AIESEC is present in 95 countries, has over 20,000 members and provides over 4,000 life changing internships every year. AIESEC is the world's largest youth network and essentially stands for the development of youth leadership for a positive impact. AIESEC provides young people, such as you, with the opportunity to learn in a global environment, develop professional skills and cultural and global understanding, lead through action and live and work abroad. We provide unique internships in the following areas in our 95 country network:

- Development – usually with NGOs, internships relate to wide variety of issues in community development, such as HIV/Aids education.
- Education – internships related to promotion, curriculum development, teaching, and counseling in the education sector.
- Management
- Technical

What will happen when you join AIESEC (to go on an internship)?

- Participation within AIESEC- Before embarking on your exchange experience you will have the opportunity to work in a team in AIESEC to develop your personal and professional skills within a particular area.
- Selection and Application – After joining and understanding AIESEC you can enter a review process to assess your experiences and motivation for doing an AIESEC exchange.
- Preparation – AIESEC provides resources, training and support to prepare you to live and work in another country. This includes visa processing.
- Matching - You will be trained and given access to use our on-line database of international internships. The more flexible you are the better.
- Integration – AIESEC members in your host country provide support and assistance in getting setup while providing opportunities for cultural and social activities.
- Re-Integration – AIESEC supports you in the readjustment process when you return home and will provide you an avenue to share your amazing experience.

Costs

- AIESEC membership - \$5
- State Conference - \$100 (*not compulsory to attend but highly recommended*)

Exchange Costs and Details

- Cost - \$550
- Salary - For development internships, you will usually not be paid a salary (all other internship receive a graduate salary). You will be provided with a stipend (in most cases) which will cover most of or all living costs, or you will be provided with accommodation, food, etc.
- AIESEC provides: exchange preparation, administration, learning environment, etc). See above sections of Preparation, Matching, Integration and Re-Integration.
