### ENGLISH LITERATURE.

Time: two hours.

1. Write out accurately the following passages:
  - a. Six lines beginning: 'O saviour';
  - b. The passage from 'At length the raft' to "'brahim Pasha!'"
  - c. Six lines beginning: 'For what are men'.
2. Analyse fully:
 

This pilot is guiding me,  
*Lured* by the love of the genii *that move*  
In the depths of the purple sea,  
  
Wherever he *dream* . . . .  
The spirit he loves remains.
3. Define a preposition, and illustrate your answer by examples from the above passage. Parse fully the italicized words.
4. Explain the meaning of the following quotations (paying special attention to italicized words), and name the poems from which they are taken:
  - a. *Thou* bringest unto *me* a tale  
Of *visionary hours*.
  - b. Thro' the *long-tormented* air  
Heaven sent a sudden *jubilant* ray.
  - c. I laugh to see *them* whirl and flee  
*Like a swarm of golden bees*.
5. Write a full page of your book, describing vividly as an eye-witness the burning of the Château, or, as an alternative, write about half a page descriptive of the picture entitled 'The Lady of Shalott'.
6. Show that you understand all the allusions in the following, and refer them to their context:
  - a. You look to the sun, for he is your taskmaster.

- b. 'This is indeed the judgment of God'.
- c. 'In honour I gained them, and in honour I will die with them'.

7. Frame sentences to illustrate the meaning, or meanings, of each of these words, giving derivatives where possible: affect, moment, critical, honorary, honourable, invent, discover, whim.

8. Rewrite the following correctly, giving reasons for your alterations where rules of grammar are violated:

- a. This is a most important question and which must be decided at once.
- b. 'Do you think he is the man who you are seeking?'  
'I don't think'.
- c. No dinner asked the wayfarer. Nothing but supper now answered the mender of roads with a hungry face.

3. Describe shortly the events which took place between 1640 and the execution of Charles I.
4. Write notes on (a) Whigs and Tories, (b) the Cabinet system, (c) free-trade, (d) the Indian mutiny.
5. Give a short account of the following: (a) Richard Neville, Earl of Warwick, (b) Cardinal Wolsey, (c) Lord Chatham, (d) Lord Nelson.

### GEOGRAPHY.

Time: two hours.

1. Explain clearly how you would determine (a) a north and south line, (b) sun's altitude, (c) latitude.
