ENGLISH LITERATURE.

Time: two hours and a half.

[N.B. Throughout the paper candidates are required to pay special attention to the correctness of their English.]

1. An essay, covering about 450 words, or from two to three pages of your book, on:

What you did last Saturday.

or

An account of an ordinary day in your life, either in the school term, or in the holidays. [30]

2. Write out from memory the eight lines beginning 'Like a servant of the Lord', and mark the stresses in the last two lines. [10]

3. Give an account of King Louis XI as he appears in *Quentin Durward*. Do you admire his character? To what extent does he govern the fortunes of Quentin? [12]

4. Give an account of one sea fight, and of one fight on land, described in the *Story Poems* set for your study. [12]

5. Describe the *Story Poem* set for your study which seems to you to deal most powerfully with the supernatural.

or

Describe the two incidents which seem to you the most pathetic of those narrated in your *Story Poems*. [12]

6. What are the main differences between the characters of Olivia and Viola, in *Twelfth Night*?

or

To what extent do you consider that Malvolio deserves the deception practised upon him in *Twelfth Night*? [12]

7. To what do the following passages refer?

- a. She never told her love,
But let concealment, like a worm i' the bud,
Feed on her damask cheek; she pin'd in thought;
And with a green and yellow melancholy
She sat like Patience on a monument,
Smiling at grief.
- b. Blame not this haste of mine. If you mean well,
Now go with me and with this holy man
Into the chantry by: there, before him,
And underneath that consecrated roof,
Plight me the full assurance of your faith;
That my most jealous and too doubtful soul
May live at peace.

g. For ten years the enemy was not able to take the city.
h. Caesar asked Brutus to help himself.
i. The ship which Jason built sailed away to bring the golden fleece.
j. Phaethon drove the horses of the sun, but became frightened when he was in the middle of the sky.
k. If you come home soon you will see my beautiful birds. [40]
