What does a Podiatrist do?

Podiatrists :

- Diagnose and treat disorders of the foot and lower limb
- Prevent or correct foot disorders by medical, mechanical, surgical, orthotic and manipulative procedures

To be a Podiatrist you need ...

- Skills in communication
- An ability to analyse and solve complex problems
- A genuine interest in human well-being
- Good manual dexterity

Industry demands for Podiatrists are high.

- Private practice
- Hospitals
- Community health centre's
- Domiciliary Care

What does it take?

Podiatrists use:

- Interview and problem solving skills
 - Manual skills for treatment
 - Footwear knowledge
 - Manufacturing skills
