In an academic career extending over 30 years I have taught across a wide range of subject areas with enduring teaching and research interests in the history and theory of urban and regional planning; planning for fast-growing cities in Asia; urban management; sustainable urban planning and infrastructure; alternatives to motorised travel; planning law and policy; and comparative planning studies.
