Mr Heinz-Werner Engel, Principal of Ecoconseil Enterprise (ECE), environmental consultant to the European Union members, governments and organisations in Africa, America, and Asia including China, is returning to Australia from Brussels to continue to consult and advise the SA Government and industry sectors, and train environmental consultants in the use of Ecomapping™ tool.

Heinz is the driving force behind the International Network of Environmental Management (INEM), a network of over 30 environmental management organizations worldwide. While he has consulted with large corporations, including Airbus, Pirelli, Carrefour, Coca Cola and Akzo Nobel, his main interest is in assisting small and medium enterprises to improve their environmental management.

To this end, he developed his most cost-effective and time-efficient method (ISO Easy) based on his Ecomapping™ tool, which involves the use of “maps” and a standardized system of recording templates leading to the international accreditation of either ISO 14001 or EMAS. Its favoured mode of delivery is with clusters of businesses/organizations working within the same industry sector or region, resulting in very low cost installation, creation of business/organisation networks and fair returns for consultants.

Ecomapping™ is proving to be a most valuable tool in addressing challenges arising from climate change (sustainability, carbon emissions, greenhouse gases etc.) to such an extent that Heinz is currently demonstrating its versatility to the entire European community, including educational institutions from pre-school through to undergraduate and postgraduate levels.
