5. Subject to market demand, other courses may be selected with the approval of the Program Director.
6. The course Academic Skills for IT Professionals, offered in two study periods per year, must be taken in the first available study period of the program, and if failed, must be repeated in successive study periods until passed. A student who enters the program with the required skills (as determined by the Course Coordinator) will negotiate with the relevant Program Director the substitution of this core course with an elective.
7. Students who have a background, or previous studies, in a particular course may substitute a course of equal value and standing with the approval of the Program Director.
