Why do a Graduate Diploma in Aviation at UniSA?

The UniSA Graduate Diploma program is a full or part-time course leading graduates to a commercial pilot licence and multi-engine command instrument rating - professional qualifications recognised by the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) and the International Civil Aviation Organisation.

Eligible students undertaking UniSA's Graduate Diploma in Aviation may choose to defer their tuition fees by taking out a FEE-HELP loan under the Federal (Australian) Government's Higher Education Loan Program – HELP. (See below)

What will I study?

The Graduate Diploma comprises four courses which combine aviation theory and practical flight operations.

Students use state-of-the-art equipment including glass panel aircraft and a modern simulator, as well as software tools similar to those currently used by the aviation industry. Students are regularly assessed using indicators based on professional competencies and provided with detailed feedback on their performance.

Where will I study?

The UniSA Aviation Academy is located approximately 13 km north of the City of Adelaide at the Parafield Airport, adjacent to the Mawson Lakes campus.

The Academy is well equipped with lecture and briefing rooms, and has electronic links with the CASA information service, enabling students to submit flight plans and access the latest aerodrome alerts and weather forecasts.

Who is eligible?

Students studying for the Bachelor of Applied Science (Civil Aviation) LBCV, graduates of the LBCV program and graduates from any other university. The Graduate Diploma in Aviation is not available to international students.

What are the prerequisites for the course?

Applicants will be required hold a minimum Class 2 Aviation Medical Certificate.

If they are enrolled in the Bachelor of Applied Science (Civil Aviation) LBCV at UniSA they will need to have completed one half year of study in the LBCV, or have completed a minimum bachelor degree from an Australian or recognised overseas tertiary institution.

They will be required to meet the CASA English language requirements for the issue of a Student Pilot's Licence.

Applicants may be required to attend an interview with the Program Director or nominee.

What is FEE-HELP?
