Graduate Employment Outcome

Percentage Satisfied

Results from the Course Experience Questionnaire of the Graduate Careers Australia survey of graduates conducted annually. Figures refer to all graduates from Bachelor Pass, Honours and Graduate Entry degrees only.

Percentage Satisfied refers to the proportion of students who agreed, or strongly agreed, or neither agreed nor disagreed with the question, "Overall, I was satisfied with the quality of this program." This aligns with the definition used by Graduate Careers Australia for Broad Agreement.
