Aims	The ITEE Division Partnership Intern Program is a program that connects Higher Degree by Research students with industry partners through short-term (1-6 month) focused research internships to work on specific industry problems.
Benefits to Joining the Partnership Intern Program (PIP)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Partnership Intern Program allows you to transfer your skills from theory to real-world application within a short-term industry focused project. • You will have direct exposure to industry and/or government employees relevant to the project, working with them as a team to achieve the project milestones and objectives. • You get the opportunity to experience the partner environment first-hand, developing your workplace skills and improve work-readiness for future employment. • If you're not 100% sure of where you'd like to apply your research skills, the Partnership Intern Program might be a great way to start. • The opportunity to build networks within industry and government is a great way to maximise your recruitment prospects.
Funding	<p>The Division of Information Technology, Engineering and the Environment through the office of the Dean of Research and Innovation will provide funding of up to \$ 10,000 per student, which must be matched by the industry partner. Up to 10 internships will be funded per annum.</p> <p>PLEASE NOTE: Internship funding must be expended by the end of the calendar year the internship is commenced.</p>
Eligibility Criteria	<p>Are you eligible to apply for this program?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The program is open to third year HDR students (or part-time equivalent) who have the support of their supervisor, or • who have completed a Phd program within the last twelve months, or • who have submitted their thesis for examination and/or undertaking corrections. • The Academic Regulations recommend that full-time research degree students undertake paid employment of no more than 8 hours per week or a total of the equivalent of 8 hours per week over a 12 month period and thus written approval from the principal supervisor must be obtained to ensure that the student has met the requirements of his/her confirmation milestone and that the internship is not interfering with his/her study program. Please note that work commitments cannot be accepted as grounds for an extension to scholarship or to go overtime. • Students must be enrolled full time if receiving a RTP scholarship as payments may cease if the research degree student is receiving an equivalent award, scholarship or salary

	<p>providing a benefit greater than 75% of the RTPd stipend rate to undertake a higher degree by research.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The program is available to Australian citizens, permanent residents of Australia or international students. • If you are an international student visa holder you must be compliant with your requirements under your student visa. • HDR students are advised to obtain independent financial advice in relation to this program.
