Inviting female PhD candidates who are passionate about generating innovative solutions to real world problems to join a 2-day cross-disciplinary workshop at UniSA, Adelaide, on **Wednesday 11th and Thursday 12th October 2023.**

The PhD Thinkers Program is an interactive 2-day workshop discussing innovative interdisciplinary research on a contemporary work health and safety workplace issue.

The 2023 workplace issue for discussion is *'transformative change in the future of work'*, which encompasses developments such as the rise in artificial intelligence and automation. You will discuss the ethical, social and work-related implications associated with the future of work, particularly in relation to effects for female workers.

Throughout the program you will have the opportunity to network and build links with other Australian female PhD candidates, develop skills in interdisciplinary creative thinking and methodological approaches, boost career advancement and your future academic endeavours. You will build a strong network with the PhD Thinkers from the highly successful 2021 and 2022 programs!

You will learn critical research strategies and how to generate ARC research grants. Workshops and presentations will be led by an expert research team (ARC Laureate Fellow, Professor Maureen Dollard), interdisciplinary project experts (Match Studio) and UniSA's 2023 Thinker in Residence, esteemed Professor Sharon Parker from Curtin University.

Applications to join the workshop are competitive and places are limited. To be selected as a PhD Thinker, applicants must be currently enrolled at minimum in their second year as a PhD candidate in Australia. PhD Thinkers will be selected from diverse disciplines.
