Though many years have passed, the memories of my wife and I's harrowing journey in a small, overcrowded wooden boat with 40 other refugees arriving in this country remain etched in my mind.

Our perilous voyage took several weeks on the open seas, during which we suffered horrific monsoonal storms, witnessed the eruption of a volcano, and endured constant hunger and thirst. There were times when it seemed beyond reason that we would survive.

Then on an early morning in November 1977, fate smiled upon us when our battered boat landed in Darwin Harbour. After a quarantine period, we were flown to Adelaide.

We arrived here a group of exhausted and ragged-looking people after a long tortuous journey, but amazed and excited with a prospect of beginning a new life in a new country.

As a young refugee in this foreign land, I discovered that my studies for an economics degree from Vietnam were not recognised, prompting me to return to university and start all over again. This decision was the one that I never regretted.

During my time at the campus, I immersed myself in the rich tapestry of the university experience. I delved into Australian history, embraced the arts, observed the intricacies of Australian politics, social dynamics, and immersed myself in the new culture.

I made lifelong friends, honed my English language skills, delved into the world of cricket and Aussie rules footy, and even learned how Australians enjoy their beer.

Completing my degree was not just an academic achievement but also an orientation to Australian life, which I thoroughly enjoyed and cherished profoundly.

As we settled into our new life here, from desperation at the beginning, hope gradually emerged, and this hope paved the way for dreams. Dreams that continue to inspire me every single day. The rest, as they say, is history!

I extend my heartfelt congratulations to each of you, as you reach this significant milestone – the culmination of years of dedication, hard work, and perseverance. And I am privileged to share this important moment with you today.
