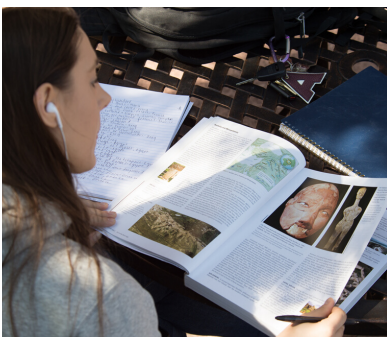
Buffalo State is situated on the Niagara frontier with easy access to Lakes Erie and Ontario, Niagara Falls, Toronto, Canada, and Western New York's exciting summer and winter recreation facilities. In addition, frequent flights and rail service in the region have made Boston, New York City, and Washington, D.C. convenient neighbors. Within walking distance are the world renowned Albright-Knox Art Gallery, the Buffalo Historical Museum, and Delaware Park including the golf course and Buffalo Zoo. Within a few miles are the Buffalo Museum of Science, Kleinhan's Music Hall, the theater district, a multitude of distinct ethnic neighborhoods, and historic architectural masterpieces. The University of Buffalo (SUNY at Buffalo), with its vast array of resources and programs, lies within a 30 minute drive of Buffalo State. Professional football, ice hockey, lacrosse, and baseball along with professional and semi-professional theater and live musical groups provide entertainment. The beautiful Western New York region is unique in that the urban streets give way to sprawling green spaces and natural parks just blocks away from the city. SUNY Buffalo State's 125-acre campus is located in downtown Buffalo, but a mere 30 minutes' drive away is the majestic Niagara Falls State Park. Each year, over 9000 students choose SUNY Buffalo State for its broad array of high-quality and distinctive academic programs; diverse and creative academic environment; hands-on-learning opportunities; affordable tuition and location in the heart of Buffalo's cultural corridor.

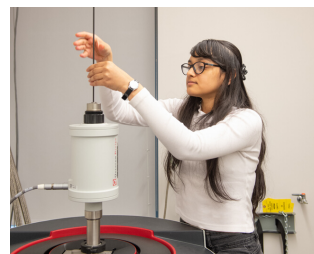
