



Student Exchange Program Fall 2021

NOTE: In light of the challenges and uncertainties posed by COVID-19, Carleton University has made the difficult decision to **not offer** in-person student mobility with the Incoming Exchange Program for the **Fall 2021 term** (September to December 2021). This decision to not proceed with in-person student exchange for the Fall is independent of any future decision regarding the delivery of courses at Carleton University for the Fall 2021 term.

Carleton is prepared to offer students the opportunity to participate in our exchange program virtually (i.e. taking courses remotely online) for the Fall 2021 term where possible.

We are continuing to watch the COVID-19 situation closely and will re-evaluate the status of student exchange for the Winter 2022 term in September/October.

Students who are nominated for the full 2021/2022 academic year should be prepared for the possibility of remote online study only in the Winter 2022 term (January to April 2022).

Minimum English Language Requirements for Graduate Students	<p>Test date should be no more than 24 months prior to application:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Internet Based TOEFL (iBT/Next Generation) 100 (<u>minimum</u> of 25 in writing, speaking, reading and listening) • IELTS 8.0 (<u>minimum</u> 7.5 in each band) • CAEL 70 (<u>minimum</u> of 60 in each band) • Pearson Test of English (PTE)(Academic): 60 overall (<u>minimum</u> 60 in each Communicative Skill)

The test report must be in English and the test date cannot be more than 24 months prior to application • Most recent official transcript <u>translated into English</u> with the Home Institution's <u>Grading System</u>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In order of priority, a list of ten (10) Carleton courses the student would like to be registered in, including course titles and course codes. • Portfolios must be included for students applying for courses in Architecture, Industrial Design and Interactive Multimedia Design (IMD) • An audition is required for performance courses in Music

English as a Second Language Courses (ESLA Courses):	To be eligible to take an ESLA course an official Proficiency Test report (TOEFL, IELTS, CAEL) is required (no exceptions or substitutes). The test report must be in English and the test date cannot be more than 24 months prior to application.

Course Selection:	<p>Course availability is subject to change and for this reason we cannot guarantee registration in specific courses. For exchange term(s) at Carleton, students should create a study plan that includes a <u>mixture of courses</u> from their major, minor, concentration and most especially free electives.</p> <p>The courses listed on an Incoming Exchange Application form will be reviewed by Carleton’s departmental advisors. If courses have been selected from more than one discipline, a request will be sent to the designated department contact for each discipline.</p> <p><u>Our academic departments will determine which courses an exchange student is approved to take.</u> Each department has their own criteria when assessing course requests, the <u>most important of which is whether a student has the required academic background to meet the course prerequisites.</u></p> <p>REMINDERS: 1) A student may not be approved to take all of the courses they have requested on their application. This can be due to a number of factors, including but not limited to: course is restricted and not open to exchange students, course is full, course is not offered in correct exchange term, course is cancelled, course conflicts with other registered courses or the student does not meet the academic prerequisites to take the course.</p> <p>2) Students requesting full year courses must be prepared to complete both terms of the course (i.e. Fall 2021 <u>and</u> Winter 2022) in order to receive academic credit for the course. This applies even if the course is offered virtually. Students must be approved by their home institution for virtual study in the Winter 2022 term if needed.</p>

	<p>Incoming graduate exchange students should be aware that the availability of graduate level courses (5000-level) changes on an annual basis and registration in specific 5000-level courses cannot be guaranteed. Learning Format for Courses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Synchronous: online courses offered in real-times where the instructor and students meet via web conferencing tools. These classes occur at scheduled days and times and students are expected to attend class at these times. • Asynchronous: online classes that are not conducted live and do not have a regularly scheduled class time. While there is a scheduled time associated with the course for registration, students can move through course material on their own schedule. Students are still expected to remain up to date with the deadlines and due dates provided by the instructor. • Blended: online courses where there is a mixture of synchronous meetings and asynchronous activities. This means students need to be prepared to meet some of the time online via web conferencing tools at scheduled days and times.

	In all cases, courses will be posted with a scheduled time (Eastern Standard Time). Asynchronous and blended courses may use the time slot for class discussion, office hours, tests or midterms, etc. Students are expected to be available during those times.
