The Talent Conundrum – connecting with UniSA Careers to access UniSA graduates and students

Many of you have been highlighting the same challenge over the past few months, one also getting plenty of coverage in the media, how to access talent?

This month I wanted to highlight some of the great tools that UniSA Careers have available to help you with this, including advertising for free on our CareerHub portal.

UniSA also works closely with industry bodies such as the <u>Australian Association of Graduate Employers</u> (AAGE), who provide insight and expertise to assist employers who recruit and develop Australian graduates. Based on the AAGE Candidate Survey 2021 (prepared by McCrindle, October 2020) here are some questions for you to consider:

- 1. Do you offer internship programs, vacation work or casual/part-time work for students? *This is where we can obviously help!*
- 2. Are you using the UniSA CareerHub jobs board to advertise your opportunities? This is regularly monitored by students and alumni
- Do you provide graduate roles with a high quality of work and career development opportunities? "The top reason for candidates joining an employer is the opportunity for career progression, followed closely by the quality of work they will be doing"
- 4. Is your recruitment process streamlined?
