


Planning your Museum visit





Getting to Samstag Museum

Kaurna Country 55 North Terrace Tarntanya/Adelaide SA 5000

Hawke Building, University of South Australia, City West precinct.

Samstag is located on North Terrace in Tarntanya/Adelaide, at the University of South Australia's City West campus, an easy 15-minute walk from the city centre. Find us on the corner of Fenn Place and North Terrace. Entry via the ground floor of the Hawke Building.

LOADING ZONES: There is a drop-off and pick-up zone for private vehicles located in front of the museum, on North Terrace. However, please be aware that these loading zones are frequently occupied and alternative plans should be made in advance.

BY TRAM: Free city trams to Samstag operate daily. Exit at the City West stop. Samstag is located 100 metres from the tram stop, on the corner of Fenn Place and North Terrace.

BY BUS: Multiple bus stops are located within close walking distance from Samstag.

BY TRAIN: Adelaide Railway Station is a ten-minute walk from the museum. Exit the station, turn right onto North Terrace and walk west 600 metres.

BY CAR: Paid parking stations are located along North Terrace. Wilson Parking is located one block away on the corner of Hindley Street and Clarendon Street.

Samstag is committed to ensuring its programs and activities are accessible to everyone.

Access

All areas of the Museum are accessible by wheelchair. The Hawke Building can be accessed via a ramp at the main entrance. The Museum has flat-floor access to Gallery One and elevator access to Galleries Two and Three. All spaces are accessible via automatic sliding doors.

We welcome guide dogs and assistance dogs.

Samstag runs sensory friendly sessions every Wednesday morning between the hours of 10 am and 12 pm for the duration of each exhibition season. These sessions offer a quieter and more relaxed veiwing experience by turning down the volume on all audio recordings.

Access bathroom facilities are located on the ground floor next to the elevators.

Samstag provides an access map identifying key physical access and sensory considerations for each of our exhibitions. Visitors can download a copy of the current map from the '**Visit**' page on our website, or ask for a printed copy at the reception desk.

Arriving at Samstag

We ask that school groups review art gallery etiquette before their visit.

Key items include:

- Quiet talking
- Careful and respectful movement through the space
- Consideration of other visitors in the space
- Touching the artworks is not allowed, unless otherwise informed
- Food and drink are not allowed inside the gallery
- Photographs are allowed to be taken inside the gallery, however, please refrain from using a flash

On arrival, please notify the gallery attendant at the front desk.

Student bags can be stowed in the cubby holes located under the long bench, next to the stairs.

If you are booked in for a gallery tour or education program, please wait in the foyer for a staff member to meet you.

Bathroom facilities are located on the ground floor, next to the elevators.

There are many other opportunities to take advantage of while in the area, making it easy to plan a day of activities in the city.
